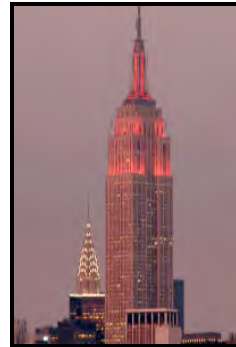
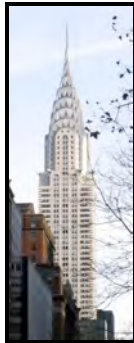

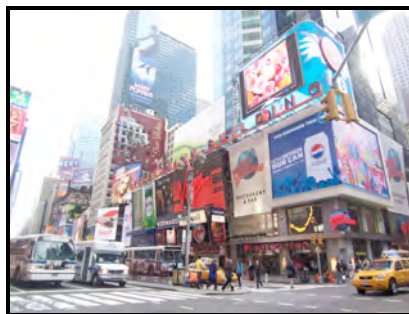
New York City. Gotham. Metropolis.

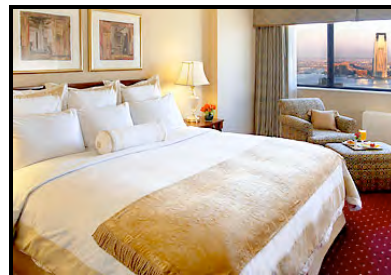
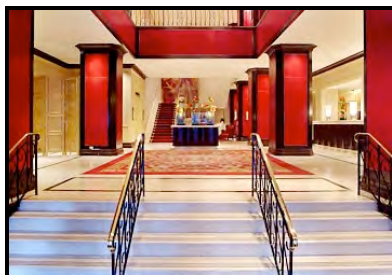
